Our Objectives and Activities

Health and Wellbeing of all Children: SDG3

Providing Medical Emergency Support to Children – Child Help Foundation is committed to save the lives of Children from congenital anomalies and non-communicable diseases like childhood cancer, acquired heart diseases, organ failure and respiratory diseases. We ensure that children with serious illness don't die in the dawn of their lives. CHF provides these children with best treatment and care in the hospitals. As of today, our efforts have saved 1098 critically ill children across India.

Promoting Quality Education which is Inclusive: SDG4

Education – Child Help Foundation aspires to provide quality education that is inclusive. The aim is to empower underprivileged children to become informed, competent and compassionate thus making them responsible global citizens. CHF has made a positive impact in the lives of 4,61,992 children.



Ensuring Access to Clean water and Sanitation: SDG6

Clean Water and Sanitation – Improving Sanitation is a key priority of the government which has introduced its flagship programme the ‘Swachh Bharat Abhiyan’ to clean India. Child Help Foundation has been on the forefront in promoting dignity and safety by facilitating the provision of clean, separate toilets for boys & girls with wash facilities. We also promote menstrual hygiene to ensure that the adolescent girls are taken care of in residential schools. CHF has constructed toilets and WASH facilities in 15 schools, which have directly benefited 27,457 children.

Standing up for Gender Equality: SDG 5

Gender Equality – Child Help Foundation works at the grassroots level to promote education for female children and our campaign is aligned with the national flagship programme, “Beti Bachao Beti Pado.” Our educational programmes create equal opportunities for both boys and girls, thereby creating a better balance for both genders. CHF under its Gender Equality programme was able to reach more than 2,00,000 children.

Let no child die of starvation, Striving for Zero Hunger: SDG 2

Zero Hunger – Child Help Foundation strives to reduce the percentage of malnutrition in the predominant cities and rural areas. This will decrease child mortality while also improving nutritional Status. CHF has supported 1025 children through our Zero Hunger Programme.

Humanitarian Relief: SDG 11, 13 AND 17

Humanitarian Relief – Child Help Foundation has been at the forefront in responding to Natural Calamities. After the extensive devastation of the floods in Uttarkhand, Assam, Bihar, Kerala, and Odisha, our teams reached out to provide immediate relief to 66,895 affected Victims.

Life on Land: SDG 15

Child Help Foundation in the year 2019- 2020 also undertook new programmes like Life on Land partnered with Street Animals to feed Stray Animals in the Mira Bhayander Belt. We were able to provide food to 2039 animals.

Life below Water: SDG 14

Child Help Foundation in the year 2019 -2020 began the new initiative of Beach Clean Ups with For Future India. We successfully removed plastics and other rubbish materials from the beaches of Gorai, Manori, Velankanni and Juhu. CHF has helped save 1,50,000 marine species.

Child Help Foundation partnered with Khushiyaan Foundation to provide warm freshly prepared meals and reached out to 2, 65,835 people. The major beneficiaries were the daily wagers, security guards, slum dwellers and migrants who were surviving hand to mouth.

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Key Highlights:

In our 10th year, CHF which has offices located across 11 different states, was able to overcome challenges and surge ahead in its mission to transform lives of underprivileged children. These were children affected with Cancer, Congenital Heart Defects, and other non – communicable diseases. CHF believes that children should not die at the dawn of their lives and with proper intervention they can go on to become responsible citizens of India. Child Help Foundation believes in transforming lives of underprivileged children and giving them a fair chance at life to become everything they dream to be in the coming future. In 2019 –2020 we could touch 3,64,166 lives of children.

Key Results:

1. Medical Emergency Support to Children: SDG3

- Childhood Cancer Awareness Programme was conducted in schools, with the active participation of 1,10,600 students and 4,500 teachers.
- The organisation could save 94 lives of Children of non-communicable diseases, cancer, organ transplant and Kidney failure.
- Baby feeding centres were constructed for feeding mothers in Palghar, Boisar in Maharashtra and Katihar in Bihar.

2. Inclusive Education: SDG4

- Library was set-up in North East and Maharashtra through Project Gyanam reaching to 2485 students.
- 567 children were reached out through Child Care Institutions with Education Support.
- Education Scholarships were provided to 47 students from Naigaon.
- There were 42 students who were reached through the Centre for Excellence Programme and cleared their 10th Standard with 100% pass for the first time.

3. Access to clean Water and Sanitation: SDG6

- 20 toilets, 20 Washbasins and 40 Urinals were constructed at Government Schools in Maharashtra benefiting 7000 children.
- 10 water filters were constructed in Naigaon, Palghar and Dadar benefiting 2064 children.
- School Wall Painting was rolled out in a school in Jai Bharath Nagar, Karnataka benefitting 160 students.
- 40 students were availing Water Filters in Kolar District in Karnataka.

Hygiene:

- There were awareness sessions on Menstruation Hygiene and Reproductive Health in Bhopoli, Palghar and Pali Ashram schools. This was in Partnership with Volkart, Mastek and NRB Corporates. There were 1865 Adolescent Girls participants for these awareness sessions.
- Child Help Foundation organised Menstrual Hygiene awareness programme at Nashik, Kurla, and Ahmednagar. 644 women participants attended this awareness session and 12,880 sanitary pads were distributed as part of the event.



- 47 adolescent girls were given Awareness Sessions on Menstrual Hygiene and Management at Kolkata.

4. Gender Equality: SDG 5

- Child Help Foundation conducted several gender equality programmes across the country and were able to reach more than 1 lac children.
- 2 Girl Children were benefitted through the Support of Child Help Foundation in Chennai.
- Dadasaheb's Phalke Grandson, Chandrakant Pusalkar visited at our Child Care Institution, Desire Society in Mumbai.
- International Women's Day celebration with Child Help Foundation Women Staff.
- Prevention of Sexual Harassment was conducted for Child Help Foundation Staff.

5. Zero Hunger: SDG 2

- Child Help Foundation reached out to 713 malnourished children in Jharkhand. Through this initiative we could provide them with nutritious meals that would help them reduce their nutrition deficiency.

6. Humanitarian Relief: SDG 11, 13 & 17

- Relief Operations were conducted in four badly affected regions in the state of Maharashtra. In Sangli and Kolhapur we reached out to 16175 people, covering 6995 families and touching the lives of 2670 children
- Maharashtra :The Relief Kits, were also distributed to 2445 families and 1070 children were given biscuit packets in relief operation at Kakhe and Degwadi village of Kolhapur
- 800 families and 185 children were provided with relief items in Rajapur village.
- Karnataka: Distributed relief items in Ramadurg and Hubli benefitting 650 individuals.
- During Floods, 451 families were reached out with rations in North East and 902 children were provided aid.
- Reached out to 100 flood Victims in Kerala

7. Life on Land

Child Help Foundation had a new initiative this year of feeding stray animals. The total stray animals fed during this period that met their hunger through intervention of CHF is 2,039.

8. Life below Water

Child Help Foundation has extended its wing in protecting marine life and curbing climate change. Child Help Foundation partnered with For Future India to clean up three beaches of Mumbai and was able to remove 4,790 kilos of trash and could save 1,50,000 marine species..



Good Health & Well Being (SDG3)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation under its flagship programme of providing Emergency Medical Support has catered to parents from weaker section of the societies and helped in providing medical aid to more than 227 children this year.





GOOD HEALTH AND WELLBEING: SDG3

Emergency Medical Support (Flagship Programme of CHF)

Good health and well-being are one of the 17 sustainable development goals declared by the United Nation (UN) to be achieved by the year 2030.

Life expectancy has increased in leading to a drop in infant and maternal mortality rate. But the world is still off track to achieve its SDG 3 Goal "Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for everyone at all ages". At least 400 million people have no basic healthcare, and 40 percent lack social protection. More than 1.6 billion people live in fragile settings where protracted crises, combined with weak national capacity to deliver basic health services, present a significant challenge to global health. Child Help Foundation focuses majorly on SDG 3. Emergency Medical Support which is related to SDG3 is our flagship programme. Under this programme, CHF looks forward to improving the life span of children between the ages of 0-14. We are committed to saving as many lives of children as possible.

Child Help Foundation supports the treatment of children who are from poor economic families and are not in a position to afford the treatment of their children's surgery. Till date CHF has supported 1098 children for their medical treatment and is still looking forward to being the angels in life of the underprivileged children.

CHILDHOOD CANCER

Cancer occurring in children between 5 – 14 years is rampant. In other words, this is called Paediatric Oncology - Medical Care given to children suffering from Cancer. It is better Curable than Adult Cancer. The next resort after detection is treatment; it is estimated that about 60,000 children and adolescents aging between 0-18 years are being diagnosed with cancer each year and only one out of 10 receives complete therapy.

The Childhood Cancer or Paediatric Oncology is treated in one of the best Specialties or Hospital Centres where children have access in getting their treatment. The treatment can include:

- Surgery
- Chemotherapy
- Radiation
- Bone marrow transplant

The Oncologists might take two or three modes of treatment depending on severity and type of cancer. The developed countries show an 80% success rate for the cure of the disease. Child Help Foundation takes cases related to cancer and works with various doctors and hospitals to find a cure for the disease.

Coping with Cancer- Coping with Cancer is all about how the patient adjusts to the treatment of Cancer. The treatment varies with the type of Cancer. There is a combination of therapies like Chemotherapy, Radiotherapy and Surgery. These treatments may cause side effects and may cause physical changes which are not favourable. The treatment duration varies from Leukaemia treatment for 2 1/2 years, PNET and Osteosarcoma over 1 year, Retinoblastoma over 6-12 months and Acute Myeloid Leukaemia over 4 -5 months. If the child relapses during or after treatment, the treatment cycles may be repeated. If a bone marrow transplant (BMT) is indicated, the BMT itself takes about one month. Chronic Cancers can be treated for several years.

Child Help Foundation- Child Help Foundation aids children who are in critical care. The support is extended to under-privileged children who need treatment and cannot meet the costs. Child Help Foundation believes that the Children shouldn't die at the beginning of their lives if provided with treatment at the right time. Children with Cancer patients are referred to Child Help Foundation. There are 31 Network Hospitals that Child Help Foundation is tied up with. The child is referred to the Special Hospital for its care. The Foundation enables the case and is then presented in the online Portal to raise funds for the treatment. The Foundation pools in resources like our Online Fund-Raising Campaigns, Tele-calling Teams, and Media Advertisements for promotion and exposure of the need of the case.

Improving the Outcome for Children with Cancer- The 2019 – 2020 marks another milestone where Child Help Foundation served 10 years for children suffering from severe and terminal illnesses. This year we served 19 children suffering from Cancer. The Childhood Cancer treatment has increased the chances of treatment. The case intakes of children referred to Child Help Foundation has shown significant improvement. The treatment advances have led to significant cure in the children. The Medical Social Workers, the Hospital and Parent connection with Child Help Foundation has brought a great friendly approach towards the Paediatric Cancer patient enlightening hope and stamina to fight the disease.

Jivadaya Foundation is a Non Profit Organisation which works exclusively for Pediatric patients. Child Help Foundation is supporting staff who are based in Indore, Bhubaneswar and Raipur. The center is known for its Palliative Care Services and improving the quality of life of patients. This is executed through guidance, counseling and extending Psycho Social Support to patients. 102 newly registered patients benefited under this initiative. These patients were given treatment services, guidance and also supported with Financial services by networking with other local NGOs and also by making them aware of the various government schemes. All the beneficiaries were from underprivileged sections of the society.



Referral System in Place- Child Help Foundation reaches out to several Childhood Cancer patients in a month. These children are referred by the Partner Hospitals through the Medical Professionals or Social Workers. When a child is diagnosed with Cancer, the Parents are in a dilemma of accumulating the finances required for the child's treatment which is hefty. This is the central point where the foundation has been supporting poor patients in cash or in kind. The financial counselling and treatment expenses are borne by Child Help Foundation. The paediatrics treatment, medical and travel is taken care of by Child Help Foundation.

In the Hospitals- Child Help Foundation helps the paediatric with good care and counselling throughout their hospital journey. They work alongside the medical partners in the Paediatric oncology wards.

In the Community- The support extends even for the children's education which enables their overall development. This helps the child to adapt to the new normal phase of school. The child has to adapt to the long term side effects of the treatment due to Cancer. The child is taken full care of reaching their terminal stages when the child and family goes without hopes from hospital that the team gives the child satisfying Palliative care which is beyond a hospice care.

Follow up- After the Hospital Care, the patients are looked after at the domestic level. The children are given Home Based Care. Child Help Foundation is at a pivotal stage to do the follow up of Chemotherapy, Medication and other follow up till overall improvement is seen in the child.

Networking with Best Hospitals or Medical Professionals- Child Help Foundation is maintaining a network of 31 Hospitals across India. CHF works seamlessly to get in touch with the best of Doctors, Nurses and Medical Professionals. The tie ups are with the best of the oncology departments. These hospitals have the best of the machines and tools for diagnosis and further treatments.

CANCER AWARENESS DRIVE IN SCHOOLS IN CHENNAI



Child Help Foundation in Chennai did awareness drives to create awareness on cancer, health hazards, suggest measures to control cancer and teach children the symptoms & causes for cancer. The message to the society at large was that cancer is very much curable if it's detected early. The cases from the institutions are referred to CHF and it is taken up on priority basis. The children affected by cancer are supported for medical treatment along with counselling for parents to overcome the traumatic situation. These children are also given education support post treatment to avoid dropouts.

The awareness drives were conducted at premier education institutions like Kendriyavidyalaya, Gateway International School, Maharishi Vidyamadir, Bhavan, Vidyasharam, Chinmayavidyalaya, Periyar Group of Schools, Indian Public School to name a few. The Awareness Programme was conducted in 140 schools. The awareness drive saw participation from 1,10,600 students and 4,500 teachers

Health Camps

Child Help Foundation has spearheaded health camps in various regions viz. Two schools in Asansol with HLG hospital and Topsia in West Bengal. The project focused on providing free and quality diagnostics, treatment and referral targeting children in the age group of 6 -14 years from standard V to standard X. The programme is aimed for providing healthy living to children below 18 years of age. The secondary objective was aimed for building a good rapport with the students, teachers and management for future collaborative association.

Activities

- i. Full Body General Check-up: A general health check-up of the child was done by the General Physician and health assessment of each student was compiled.
- ii. Eye Check: With excessive exposure to Mobile Phones, TV, and Computers there has been a gradual increase in the number of kids requiring spectacles. Optometrist and ophthalmologist did eye check-up for all students and ensured remedial action for students with weak eyesight. The health camp examined 343 school students in this region.



There was an initiative of conducting a health camp in two schools in Palghar viz. Pali Ashram Shala and Bhudawali Aashram Shala in Wada, in collaboration with Aastha Hospital, Manor, and Palghar district. The primary objectives of the camp were to identify the issues related to anaemia and menstruation in adolescent girls, in the government residential schools. The doctors shared fitness tips which need to be followed during menses. Further, the list of proper nutritional benefits and hygienic routine was conveyed to the beneficiaries. During examination it was noticed that many girls were suffering from Cardinal Diseases which affected their menstrual cycle. This was soon brought to the notice of the Medical Specialist and Gynaecologist for further medical advice. There were 550 adolescent girls who were examined through this camp.





BABY FEEDING CENTRE



Palghar station baby Feeding centre

The Baby Feeding Centre Gets First 'Baby Feeding Corner' in Mumbai with the initiative of Child Help Foundation, in partnership with Western Railways (Mumbai Division). The Centre was inaugurated by Sandesh Chiplunkar, Commercial Inspector, Western Railway (Mumbai), along with Jiji John (Executive Director-Child Help Foundation) and Rajendra Pathak (Managing Trustee Child Help Foundation).

The baby feeding centre is located on Platform Number One. The feeding centre is well secured and gives privacy to nursing mothers who otherwise face inconvenience in feeding their babies while travelling. For babies, having breast milk for the initial six months is highly advocated by doctors for breastfeeding because of the nutrition quotient present in the mother's milk. This helps babies to build a strong immune system and live a healthier life ahead. The bond between the mother and child also grows stronger and empowers both to lead a healthy life. This initiative is in alignment with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal No.3 – 'Good Health and Wellbeing'.





Breastfeeding Centre at Katihar Railway Station

Breast Feeding Centre was constructed at Katihar Railway station (Bihar) & New Jal Paiguri -NJP (West Bengal) is in pipeline. Child Help Foundation led and took consent from the Railway Authorities. Northeast Frontier railway has installed the first baby feeding centre at Katihar Station in Katihar Division. According to Mr J.B Paswan (CCMI, Katihar), the baby feeding centre in Katihar station is a very nice initiative and it will help thousands of travelling mothers. Katihar Railway constructs - A dedicated room to ensure privacy and dignity for lactating mothers while breastfeeding their infants. The centre has been constructed with efforts by Child Help Foundation in collaborative support from the Eastern Railway and is free to use by lactating mothers.

Passengers also shared their feedback on this concept of a baby feeding centre at the platform and shared how helpful it is for them. DRM, Katihar Sri Ravindra Kumar Varma ensured to set-up the board with the direction of the Feeding Centre, also ensured the announcement in station regarding this centre. DCM and volunteers also participated in this event.

It can be extremely difficult and embarrassing for mothers travelling with infants to breastfeed their babies in public. Breastfeeding in public is a struggle the world over, and echoing the sentiment Child Help Foundation in partnership with Western Railways is facilitating the construction of baby feeding rooms in 5 stations as a pilot project. The campaign, with support from local authorities, is helping mothers to breastfeed their infants with dignity when they are out and about.



When a dirty nappy needs changing, and when an infant needs to be fed or taming down the baby feeding room is the answer. CHF has now set up a second baby feeding centre at Boisar railway station, the baby feeding centre is equipped with the facilities such as nappy dispensers, private feeding areas that provides both the mother and the child much-needed comfort. The centre is equipped with a sofa set and a wall fan. The room is well-ventilated and baby-friendly.

Awareness on Breastfeeding Centre

An Awareness Programme was conducted for lactating mothers to use the centre and how to feed at public places while using baby feeding centres at built stations in Palghar. There were more than 81 people reached through this awareness programme. The Street Play was well applauded by the bystanders and travellers during the day.

Congenital Heart Diseases

The majority of cases taken up by Child Help Foundation in year 2019 – 2020 were of heart diseases. There were 46 children who underwent heart surgeries for Congenital Heart Defects. The word “congenital” means existing at birth, although terms “congenital heart defect” and “congenital heart disease” are often used to mean the same thing, but “defect” is more accurate. A congenital heart defect (CHD) results when the heart, or blood vessels near the heart, don’t develop normally before birth. The most common cases caused are through birth cases. The prevalence of Congenital Heart Disease has seen 2, 00,000 Indian children facing the same trauma every year. Considering this statistics one fifth of them needs intervention, if these children undergo surgeries without delays then these children can grow up to be a normal adult.

Paediatric Cardiology

The prevalence of the disease is so huge but the intervention is not clear in the addressing. There are over 2 lakh children suffering this defect but only less than 5 % are given the medical care they require. Most of them pass away even without celebrating their first birthday. The Burden of the disease is huge, as there are over 78,000 infants dying every year because of Congenital Heart Defects. Paediatric cardiology involves structural and functional heart disease from the foetus to adulthood and requires the application of knowledge regarding changing physiology to specific conditions and interventions. It is very interventional (particularly in the context of paediatrics) in terms of both surgical and medical therapies.

Paediatric Cardiac Care

Paediatric Cardiac Care is essential for children suffering from Coronary Heart Diseases (CHD) but this care is available to very few children. There are private hospitals available with the facilities of the latest equipment for ensuring Paediatric Cardiac Care. The Parents are of the lower middle classes and are unable to bear the cost of hospitalization. For most cases medical insurance is non-existent in India while there are over 2, 00,000 cases prevalent each year in India, one fifth of them are referred for Medical Intervention. Child Help Foundation takes the initiative in such cases and helps parents to afford the treatment to help see their child survive.

Child Help Foundation anchors this programme with the motto of "Saving lives of children" with dreams and aspirations in living their lives to the fullest through meeting their treatment expenses, presenting success stories of children benefited from Child Help Foundation.

ATHMIKA BINU

Athmika (8months) is the only daughter of Binu (Father) who is a driver and Reshmi (Mother) who is a housewife. Residing in Kanhira Maliyil House in Kasargode, Kerala. Athmika suffered from Congenital Agenesis of Sternum, a rare chest wall malformation resulting from failed midline fusion during embryonic development. Athmika before intervention used to continuously suffer from pain in her chest and suffered from a respiratory problem. The sternum or breastbone was partially missing in Athmika. Athmika was referred to Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences, where a team of cardiac surgeons, anaesthetists and plastic surgeons put in their best efforts to help Athmika attain a normal life. The child was given special provisions of ICU (Bed and nursing), blood processing, ventilator support and other medicines. This surgery was done under special protection as it was one of its kinds that have happened for the 1st time in the hospital. The Cost of the operation amounted to Rs. 3,75,000/- "This surgery has helped Athmika attain a normal living. Athmika has recovered fast due to the blessings she received from everyone. We are very thankful to Child Help Foundation." - Binu (father).

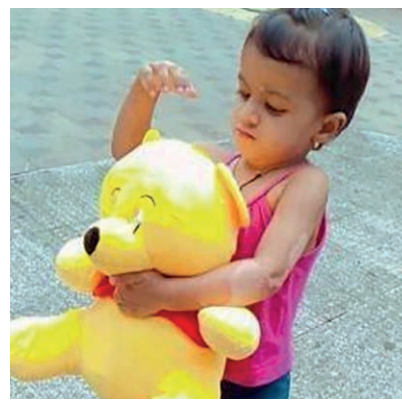
NABA ANSARI

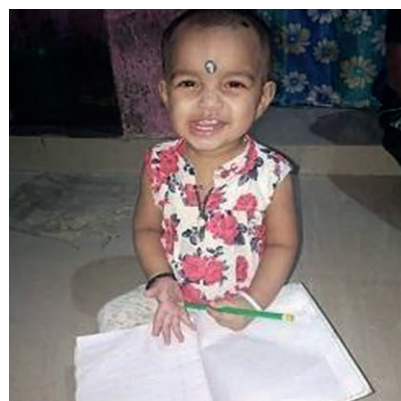
PRANJAL WARKHANDKAR

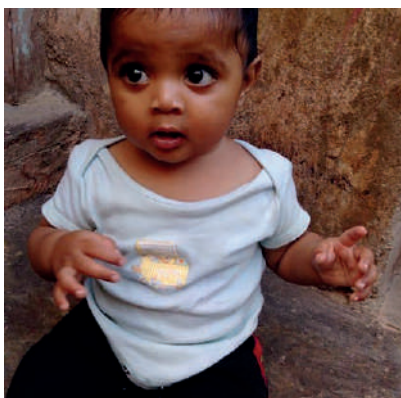

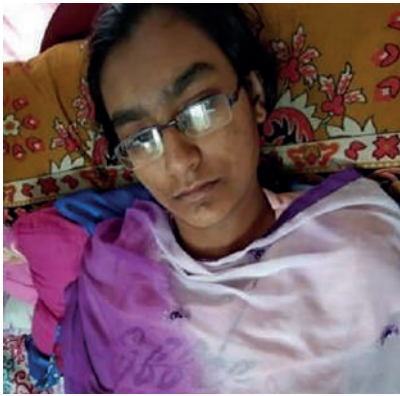




SNEHA TARKASE

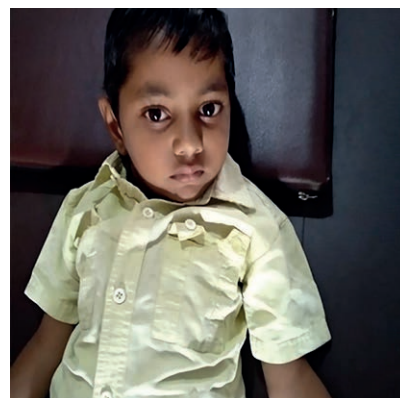
ADITI KALE

This is when Child Help Foundation Came forward to help Mr.Santosh Kale financially. Aditi was later operated in Sahayadri Hospital.

CHF took up the case to support Masarat's treatment and raised the amount of Rs. 2,30,000/- for the surgery. ANUJ GAUD

Anuj is a 16-year-old boy from Mumbai and belongs to a family of 5 members consisting of his parents and two younger siblings studying in 4th and 5th standards. Anuj is a fun-loving kid who dreams of a bright future; however he started to keep getting sick with frequent stomach pain. However after 2 months his condition further deteriorated and his parents rushed him to the hospital. The doctors at Asian Cancer Institute which is considered one of the best hospitals in Mumbai ran some tests on Anuj and diagnosed him with Testicular Germ Cell Tumor. Anuj's parents were shattered on hearing this and the huge cost involved in his treatment added to their worries. Anuj's uncle saw the plight of the distraught parents and suggested the name of Child Help Foundation (CHF) which aims to provide assistance in cases of medical emergency for those children whose parents cannot afford the treatment. Anuj's parents contacted CHF and the staff at CHF took note of all the necessary information about the child's condition and assured to help them for his treatment. CHF successfully raised Rs. 3,88,712/- for Anuj's treatment. Ashok Gaud (Father) "I am working in a private company and my wife is a homemaker. I was worried about how I will pay for my child's treatment. Some of our family members helped in raising some funds and the remaining was raised by Child Help Foundation. I am grateful to Child Help Foundation that with their efforts our child's life was saved. Now Anuj can start living a normal life again."

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation, in the year 2019-20, was able to provide Quality Education Support to more than 3000 children through various programmes which has aided children to have a better future for themselves and their families.





EDUCATION

Promoting Inclusive Quality Education: Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG4)

The Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG4) targets to reach out for Universal Education. There has been a reduction in the total count dropouts in schools even in developing countries. Child Help Foundation has been a motivation for the missions in its target areas in promoting education which is a powerful vehicle for Sustainable Development. It helps in the long run of aiding children in getting affordable vocational training, to eliminate gender and wealth disparities, and achieve universal access to a quality higher education.

Education Support: Child Care Institutions

Child Help Foundation (CHF) has worked extensively on Pan India basis towards United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. In the year 2019-2020 there were massive improvements seen in the lives of 567 children supported by CHF. By ensuring inclusive and quality education for underprivileged children who were abandoned, orphaned or single parent children will continue their education through Child Help Foundation. This support has ensured that these children have a better chance at life by staying in various Child Care Institutions.

By facilitating education to underprivileged children CHF empowers them to be robust citizens who are mentally and physically alert as mentioned in the National Policy for Children.

Tuition Centres in Bihar: In Bihar, Child Help Foundation supports two education initiatives one in Sikarhatta, Dagmara and the other in Lalmanpatti- Dudhaila in Supaul district of Bihar. The two-education centres mainly cater to children from the marginalized communities. Presently there are 85 children in both the centres with children from class 1 to 8. These children are taught English, Hindi, Mathematics and Science. The centres have been running even during heavy floods in Bihar.



Centre for Excellence (CFE) Child Help Foundation has a Centre for Excellence (CFE) programme to assist children studying in 10th standard. The marks received in 10th std is very crucial in the lives of the children that decide their destination and future streams of life; CHF appointed specially qualified teachers to teach Mathematics, Science and English to children from Sakhare Ashram Shala located in Palghar District. The Sakare Ashram Shala is a government Aided School. These children belong to tribal communities with no access to quality education. Centre for Excellence Programme follows the teaching methodology, which focuses on the board exam perspective and gives practices that the students earn maximum marks in their board exams.



- Supportive classes in 3 subjects' viz. Science, Mathematics and English were provided to the 42 students of X standard, Batch 2019- 2020 which commenced from the month of July 2019.
- The Basics or the essential formulas are taught in the main subjects of Science, Mathematics and English that help them to solve real problems and give clarity on the concepts.
- The students have shown improvement in the fundamentals of English subject in a months' time. In the survey conducted before the commencement of the academic session, it was observed that the students were not able to recite the English alphabets.
- The Project Intervention was since December 2018 and has resulted in the increase in confidence level of the students as regular feedback and suggestions are conveyed by them to Project Coordinator.



- Project Outcome: There were 43 students of Centre for Excellence who cleared their 10th exams with highest scores in Mathematics, Science and English. The education of girl children has created equal opportunities for both girls and boys of tenth standards. From the past two years the results showcase that CFE has had an impact on their performance in a positive way.
- The Child Help Foundation is looking to cater to more schools in the Jawhar Block, which is likely to boost education impact indicators in Palghar-District.

TAJ Wellington Mews Donated 45 question sets of previous year's 10th standard board exams to the students of 10th standard at Sakhare School. They also gave writing pads and supplement papers for the children. Previous year question papers are the most important and useful study material to get the complete idea about the 10th standard exam pattern. For the last few years it has been noticed that the questions pattern of any competitive exam is nearly the same, so preparing for exams from the previous year papers is very insightful. To help the children prepare with ease, the sets of question papers were also provided with their correct answers.



Setting up of libraries in Palghar District Schools



Child Help Foundation firmly believes that education is a window to the outside world. Hence, the project team in the western region has channelized their efforts to promote reading rooms and libraries at all the schools in the Palghar district. Child Help Foundation was able to generate resources through Pratham's website, a crowdfunding site. School libraries were set up in Sakhare, Bhopoli, and Pali, Budhawali Ashram Shala in Wada, Palghar in Maharashtra distributed around 394 books. This will develop a healthy reading habit amongst the children, thus boosting their knowledge and in turn enhance their personality and self-confidence. This benefitted 800 Children from 4 Ashram Shalas. Our endeavour is to continuously keep on improving the learning outcomes of these children. We hope that with time the children will inculcate the habit of reading and keep learning.



School Scholarship Programmes:

Child Help Foundation aligning to the mission of reaching out to the marginalized children will help meet the educational needs of 46 students mostly from Karamveer Bhaurav Patil School who were given scholarships. One kind donor helped these children and also gave Christmas cards to them. For over 10 years, Child Help Foundation has educated children from low-income communities targeting more of first generation learners in the interior villages through supporting children from shelter homes, orphanages and sponsorship programmes. Today, we are at the forefront of ensuring children from the marginalized community have access to Inclusive Quality Education. We are planning to get more School Partners so that we on the long run can meet many more educational needs of children.



School Children Provided with School Bags and Scholarships in Mumbai

It has been found that most of the children in tribal and rural areas cannot afford decent school bags resulting in textbooks and notebooks being lost, torn or kept in bad condition. School bags and other accessories to support schooling have become a very essential need for children attending school. Child Help Foundation distributed school bags and water bottles to the students of Z.P. School Sangdev Pada, Dahanu Road. The schoolbags distributed enabled the students to preserve and keep their textbooks in good condition which is a prerequisite for learning. The initiative carries a high impact since the financial burdens of the parents are lessened and the direct beneficiaries i.e. the children feel cared for and are excited to learn new things every day. This will encourage them to continue their studies and not be a dropout!

Project Gyanam – Library Set Up

Xondhan Foundation in collaboration with Child Help Foundation has initiated Project Gyanam – It is an endeavor to set up Libraries across schools in Assam. Xondhan Foundation established sixteen libraries in Assam, two in Manipur and four in Maharashtra. The library set up had books on various subjects with an instruction note on library management handed over to the school management. During the event children from standard I to VIII were given a compass box, eraser, pencils, and other useful stationery items. It was also a day out for volunteers who spent time with 8th standard students explaining to them all the aspects of student life, time management and how to be a role model for others. The total students benefited by Project Gyanam are 1,985 students across North East and Maharashtra.



Future setting up a Model School in Educationally Backward Schools

We are living in the age of technology. Usage of technology should be the call of each Model School. This will increase the Educational Capacity in students. The Model School Scheme is to be set up in Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs). The EBBs have been selected based on twin criteria of Female Rural Literacy rate being below the national average and Gender Gap in literacy being above the national average. The government has a plan to set up 3,500 model schools across the nation.

Since the launch of the scheme in 2009 -2010 till 31st March, 2015, the Ministry of Human Resource Development has approved 2,490 model schools, out of which 1,101 model schools have been made functional. The scheme has been delinked from the support of the Government of India with effect from 2015-2016 and as such the scheme stands transferred to the States/UTs.

In the year 2018–2019 Child Help Foundation, in line with the government policy, supports the state government effort in setting Model School in Educationally Backward Blocks and will partner with the corporate and Government for the same in Jawhar block of Palghar district in Maharashtra. Bhopoli Adivasi Ashram Shala was shortlisted for developing into a Model School. The school has classes from KG till Std. XIIth. It has a total strength of 720 children. It comes under the jurisdiction of Mr. S. S. Suryavanshi, who is an active advocate for the project. The infrastructure is good and teachers are very supportive.

The project setting up in Model School in the Jawhar district will focus on attracting tribal students; providing them with quality education and a special focus on Science, Maths and English. Emphasis will be given to students from Std. XIIth. It is envisaged in line with HRD (Government of India).

It will be in the pattern of Kendriya Vidyalaya and will have standard norms and building as that of Kendriya Vidyalaya (KV) with stipulations on pupil-teacher ratio, information and communications technology usage, holistic educational environment, appropriate curriculum, emphasis on output and outcome. The school would differ from Kendriya Vidyalaya in funding pattern and management structure.

Affiliation to the Board: The schools will be affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE). In exceptional circumstances, affiliation by other National Boards may also be considered. Following are some of the key features of the programme:

1. Education provided in a Model School will be holistic and integral touching upon physical, emotional and aesthetic development in addition to academics.
2. The chosen school will be built in collaboration with Government and corporate funding.
3. Infrastructure provided not only for teaching, but also for sports and co-curricular activities.
4. Sufficient scope for sports, recreation, gardens, auditorium etc., will be provided.



5. The methodology of learning will be activity based.
6. The school has adequate ICT infrastructure, internet connectivity and full time computer teachers.
7. The teacher-pupil ratio 1:25 minimum and classrooms will be spacious enough to accommodate at least 30 students.
8. The school provided Arts and Music teachers besides specific teachers as per the usual norms. The school also provides facilities for activities emphasizing Indian heritage and Art & Crafts.
9. Special emphasis may be given on teaching of Science, Maths and English. If required, bridge courses may be introduced for weak students.
10. The school curriculum should include the material/items that inculcate leadership skills and ability to deal with real situations.
11. Health Education and health check -up will be introduced in the schools.
12. A good laboratory & library with books and magazines for students and teachers will be provided.
13. Field trips and educational tours to be integral part of the curriculum.
14. Medium of instruction will be left to the state government; however special emphasis will be given on teaching spoken English.
15. Affiliation of the school to a particular examination board left to the State Government.
16. The school has competent staff to deliver expected results.

Child Help Foundation supported Prayas 2020 Annual festival of Department of Electronics in SNDT Juhu University. Our presence was prominent during this celebration and Child Help Foundation's Project Head was the Chief Guest for this event.

This year, the theme was "Communities Make the Difference." Child Help Foundation in partnership with Desire Society (Goregaon) observed World AIDS days by organising a public rally. The main motto for organising the rally was to raise public awareness about AIDS. Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) is a pandemic disease caused due to the infection of Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV), which causes fatal damage to the immune system. Child Help Foundation in partnership with Desire Society (Goregaon) observed World AIDS days by organising a public rally.

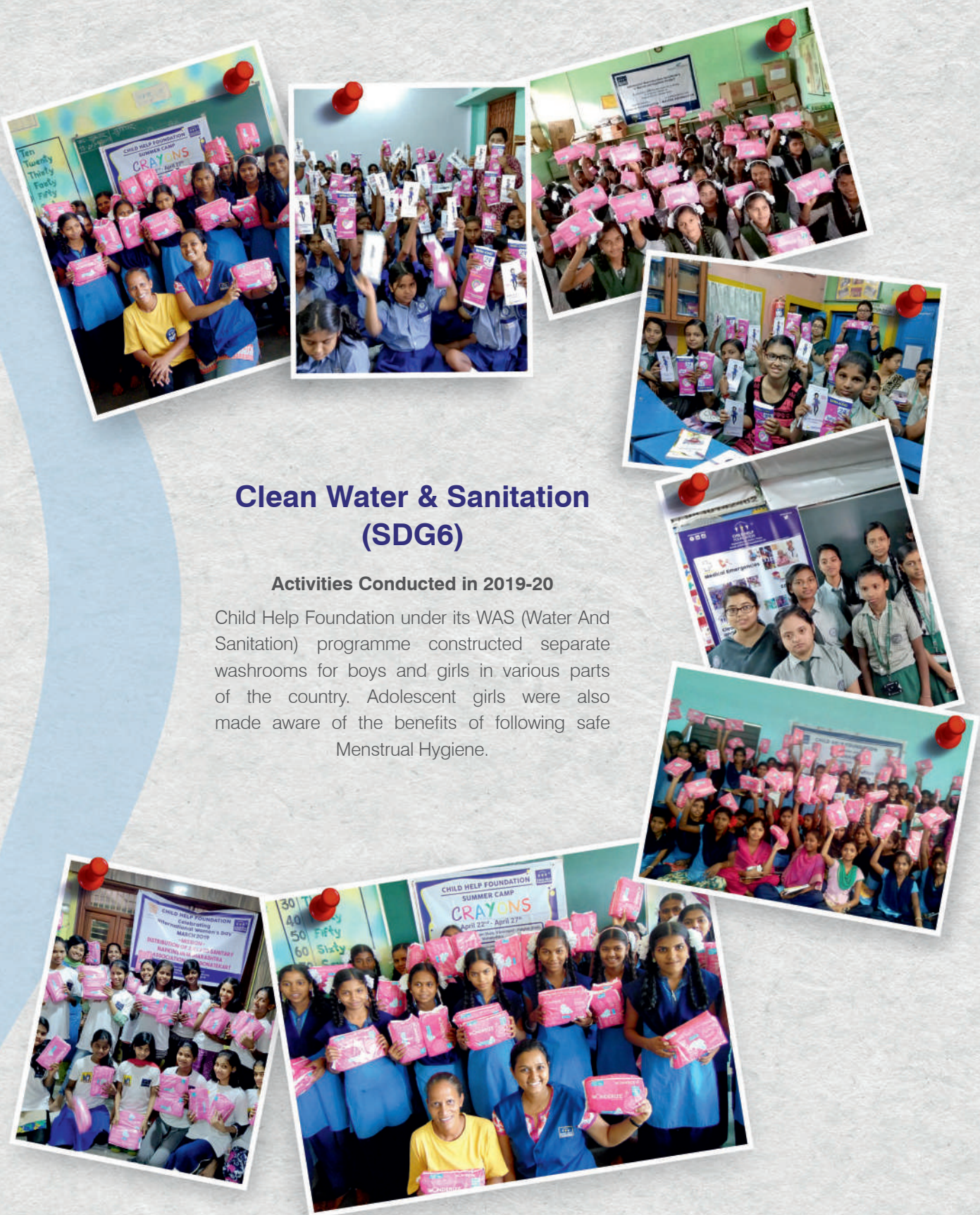


The Celebration in Office International Women's Day

Clean Water & Sanitation (SDG6)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation under its WAS (Water And Sanitation) programme constructed separate washrooms for boys and girls in various parts of the country. Adolescent girls were also made aware of the benefits of following safe Menstrual Hygiene.



WAS (Water and Sanitation)

Ensuring Availability and Sustainable Management of Water and Sanitation for all: SDG6

Every year millions of people, mostly children, die from diseases associated with inadequate water supply, sanitation, and hygiene. It is estimated that by 2050, more than half of the world's population will live in water stressed regions, as per researchers at MIT. More than two and a half billion people have gained access to improved drinking water sources since 1990, but 666 million people are still without water. Between 1990 and 2015, the proportion of the global population using an improved drinking water source increased from 76% to 91%, however, each day, nearly 1000 children die due to preventable water and sanitation-related diarrhoeal diseases. Western Region Maharashtra

In Maharashtra, there are governmental schools in Palghar District which have no separate toilets for boys and girls. Through the rapport built in these grassroots areas; Child Help Foundation identified the problem and extended their support for building separate toilets for boys and girls. This is to promote a healthy environment. This also instills a sense of responsibility to boys and girls and gives them a better mental attitude to keep the toilets clean. Even the stakeholders are educated about Hygiene and about the importance of keeping the toilets clean.

Construction of Sanitation Facilities for Children

Child Help Foundation (CHF) is helping in “Swachh Bharat Mission” where focus was given to Swachh Vidyalaya Mission. CHF Foundation gave priority to promote hygiene in Government Schools. CHF with the objective of “promoting hygiene in Schools” constructed 20 Toilets, with 40 Urinals and 20 Wash basins. This was to make visible the value of school sanitation with an aim to create a clean community and thereby raise level of ownership. The sanitation facilities built by CHF were handed over to the school management. The students and management were also provided with a proper guidance & training to maintain the facilities for future use. The construction of toilets and awareness sessions were taken on “Hygiene” or WASH has promoted family and community involvement in the sustainability of water and sanitation facilities in schools. Separate WASH facilities for boys and girls also meant that girls could now carry out their menstrual hygiene in complete privacy. Girls who used to go to fields for their sanitation needs, need not do that as proper WASH facilities are now within their grasp, which also has reduced open defecation. The project would benefit 1138 students and 40 teachers in the 8 schools in the Coastal areas of Palghar and Vasai taluka. This Project was a successful endeavour along with LIC Housing Sanitation Project.

Southern Region-Karnataka

Gutanhalli government lower primary school, Kolar district, Karnataka, India

The inauguration ceremony for the school sanitation project funded by Relevance lab and implemented by Child Help Foundation was held in Gutanhalli Government Lower Primary School, Kolar District, Karnataka, India. The sanitation project is designed to cater to the needs of the village school. The sanitation unit has a separate unit for boys and girls with access to flowing water. Overhead tanks have been put up for water storage. The school was also provided with an RO water unit so that children can avail clean drinking water. There is indeed access to safe drinking water and sanitation which are Child Rights, as recognized by the United Nation Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). For universal fulfilment of these rights of children to become reality, we will need the right systems: well-resourced, capable institutions delivering services and changing behaviour in resilient and appropriate ways.



School Painting

At Thirupuvanam Government Kannada and Tamil School, Jai Bharath Nagar, Karnataka, India

Child Help Foundation (CHF), backed by the sponsorship from Samsung India Electronics Pvt. Ltd. organised a painting activity in Government Thirupuvanam Kannada and Tamil Higher Primary School, Jai Bharath Nagar. The event covered paintings of nine classrooms including two staff rooms, corridors, hand wash station, sanitation area and a staircase. Post wall paintings, mural paintings with environment themed messages were also put up on the walls so that the ideas get registered in the children's minds. The murals also serve the purpose of beautification. The objective of the painting activity was themed on Environment with special focus to 'MAKING THE SCHOOL PLASTIC-FREE' and "Saving Water". The sketches and murals were made on the walls of the corridors, sanitation area and pillars so that it gets registered in the children's minds due to daily seeing.





About 168 students, 9 teachers and 2 other staff of Government Thirupuvanam Kannada and Tamil Higher Primary School, Jai Bharath Nagar and four hired painting labourers who are the primary beneficiaries of the activity. Additionally, since the event gave a platform to the twenty-eight volunteers from Samsung, they form the secondary beneficiaries of the activity

In the school, the leaky walls of classrooms are now beautifully painted in colours of blue, green and yellow. Samsung employees as well as their families received a platform to give it back to the society.



Project Outcome:

The Project gave 10 water tanks of 500 Litres to schools. These are schools in Naigaon and Palghar areas which are of marginalized communities. There is promotion of hygiene sessions being taken in these schools. This will thus bring a ripple effect in the communities they are staying in. Girls are having separate toilets viz. gender separated Toilets. Thus increasing attendance of girl children, this has also increased health and hygiene practices. Clean water is critical for survival while its absence can impact the health, food security, and livelihoods of families across the world. Although our planet has sufficient fresh water to achieve a regular and clean water supply for all, bad economics & poor infrastructure can skew supply unfavourably. Through Goal 6, the countries of the world have resolved to achieve universal access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation and hygiene to all in the next fifteen years. Hygiene

Menstrual Hygiene and Management

World Menstrual Hygiene Day - 28th May

The Menstrual Hygiene Day is observed every year on May 28 with the aim to spread awareness about menstrual hygiene and curb taboos associated with menstruation. The goal is to create mass awareness on importance of menstrual hygiene management, and to ensure that women and girls can manage their periods in a way that is not only healthy, but also enables their full participation in school, work, and other activities. The day intends to inculcate pride amongst the young girls and women and encourages them to break their silence against the taboo associated with this natural process. The Menstrual Hygiene Day was celebrated at Child Help Foundation Head Office with the female staff.



The Eastern Region - Kolkata

Menstruation is a natural process but it is rarely talked about because of cultural taboos. This is a crucial concern for women, her hygiene and her health which are intertwined together. It is in this context a workshop was organised by CHF - Kolkata in collaboration with Unicharm India Pvt. Ltd. (producer of Sofy sanitary napkins and Mammy Poko Pants) CSR unit for adolescent girls of Deshbandhu Vidyalaya, Kolkata, – West Bengal.

The programme focused on the capacity building of adolescent girl students and to demystify taboos surrounding menstruation, orienting them to manage the menstrual process, providing access to sanitary napkins and disposal of soiled ones. The sessions also included pre-test questionnaire, PowerPoint presentation and free distribution of sanitary pads. In all, 47 adolescent girls and two teachers participated in this workshop.



Dhenkanal District – Odisha

An awareness session on menstrual hygiene management was conducted in the Ashram Schools in Dhenkanal District of Odisha and the communities with the help of local health centre, and trained volunteers of Child Help Foundation. 1327 girls and women participated in the session. Sanitary napkins were distributed to the girls of the residential school as well as the women from nearby tribal villages. The stakeholders of the school and communities were very cooperative and helped us in making the programme a success.





The Western Region

Maharashtra - Nashik, Kurla, Ahmednagar

Menstrual Health and Management is one of the pivotal things during Adolescence. In various parts of India, there are several cultural traditions, myths, and misconceptions related to menstruation, which makes them vulnerable to genital tract infections. In order to curb the myths and spread wrong information about menstruation, the awareness sessions are giving access to the right information. Child Help Foundation organised a Menstrual Hygiene awareness programme at Nashik, Kurla, and Ahmednagar. The awareness session emphasized the importance of following personal hygiene practices especially during menstruation.



There was a good response from the target areas which had 644 women participants. The topics of PMS and menopause were benefiting elderly ladies who were present in the meeting. Post the sessions, sanitary pads were distributed to the participants.

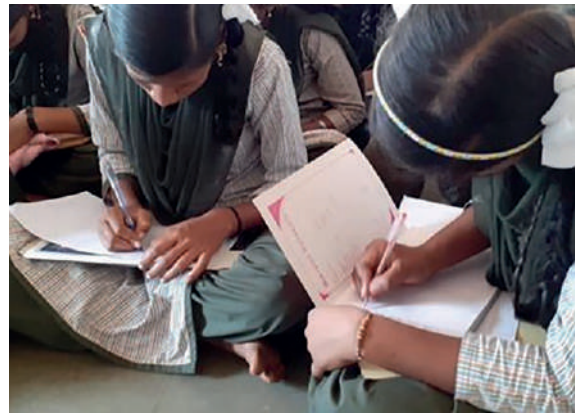
There were awareness sessions on menstruation hygiene and reproductive health in Bopoli, Sakhare, Pali and Budhawali Ashram schools. These were the target beneficiaries as per the proposal placed with the Corporate Mastek and Volkart Foundation. A large number of adolescent girls in Ashram schools are still not aware about issues related to menstruation and maintaining personal hygiene during this period while also dealing with associated physical problems. They usually do not get a proper platform to get information or discuss such issues.

The lack of menstrual knowledge, poor access to sanitary products and a non-facilitating school environment can make it difficult for girls to attend school. In Palghar, interventions have been developed to reduce the burden of menstruation for school girls by Child Help Foundation with economic support from Volkart and Mastek. We sought to identify challenges related to menstruation, and have addressed them in 4 ashram schools in Palghar district. The regular awareness sessions for adolescent girls which addressed menstruation and all associated topics related to menstruation such as, what is menstruation, calculation of the period, physical problems faced by girls during their periods and ways to deal with it, importance of maintaining personal hygiene during this period, abstaining from the wrong practice of using dirty cloths and promoting the use of sanitary napkins.



Traditional myths and misconceptions in areas related to menstruation were discussed. FAQs by the girls related to the topic were answered by the facilitator on call or even when they were conducting the sessions there. These schools have formed Kishori Committee where two or three girl representatives head the committee and act as key role members in absence of Project staff. There were two 'Kishori' committees formed in 3 schools (Pali, Bhopoli and Budhawali). The participating adolescent girls were distributed 23,040 sanitary napkins after such awareness sessions.

Quiz on Menstrual Hygiene Supported by Volkart- The quiz competition generated information related to hygiene practices followed by the students at the time of menstruation. It aimed at creating awareness and removing the taboo and social stigma surrounding menstruation. Girls were encouraged to ask their queries and give suggestions during the live sessions on Menstruation Hygiene and Management.



The quiz event was also organised to ensure every girl is empowered to manage her menstruation safely, hygienically, with confidence and without shame and where no girl is limited by something as natural as her period.

Case-Study

Case 1: Kanchan, a 13 years old girl from Ashram School in Palghar always had various worries and questions in her mind ever since she had her first period. "Why do girls bleed every month? Do boys bleed just like girls? Why do I have stomach ache?"

All her questions were cleared when Child Help Foundation started taking MHM Menstrual Hygiene Management sessions in her school. Kanchan had once said in her feedback "Didi kiti chan Watte, hya saglya prashnanchi tumhi vevasthit uttare dilit. Aata mala pali aalya var bhiti nahi vatat." (I feel so relieved to have got answers to all my questions. Now I don't fear a lot when I get periods)

Case 2: Rasika (name changed), a 12 years old girl from one of the ashram schools in Wada, Palghar had said "I and my friends have a lot of questions regarding menstruation like, Why do girls menstruate? What will happen if girls do not menstruate? I am getting my periods, but why have some of my friends not yet started menstruating?" she had many more questions apart from this.

When the sessions started the girls listened to it attentively. But they were very shy to ask questions in front of everyone. So they wrote their questions which were then answered by us in the next sessions. As the time passed, the girls started asking questions freely.



Gender Equality (SDG5)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation aims to provide equal opportunities to boys and girls. In 2019-20, CHF was able to reach more than 1,00,000 beneficiaries through our Gender Equality programme.





GENDER EQUALITY

Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls: SDG5

Gender equality talks about equality of sexes. If unable to practice equality we are losing half of the human potential. This is a mere “no” to the female gender of living life to its fullest. The equality in the area of political, social and economic spheres of women if sustained it will benefit the World’s Citizens. Then this can lead to sustainable development. The UN Secretary-General mentions that this is a human rights issue “unfinished business of our time” and “biggest challenge of the age.” Women have been playing a critical role in transforming the real status through the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. Child Help Foundation has a flagship programme of “Beti Bachao and Beti Padhao”- providing education to girl children under this programme is a must. The scholarship and the medical support provided are furnished in girl preference so that there is a great reduction of gender disparity and see the gender equality evident in our nation.

Summer Camp

Summer camp was held in 2 schools from Vikramgad, Palghari. Bhopoli Ashram Shala and, ii. Sakhare Ashram Shala for four days. The theme of the Summer Camp was “Crayons”. The Camp was organised for the standard X children of the Batch 2019- 2020. There were 109 students who participated in this camp





The objective of the summer camp was to engage children into various activities to promote their holistic development. The day started with morning yoga and ended with a bonfire. Children participated enthusiastically in different yoga asana, meditations and Pranayama which helped them turn out extra stimulation noise and negative thoughts. Session in gender discrimination was focused on addressing the gender biasness prevalent in the society and how children grow up having perception about gender based roles that people perform in their surroundings. Movies like Akira and Chennai Express were screened which the children enjoyed.

Chennai

During a Birthday Party, a donor decided to conduct fundraising for the poor children being served at Child Help Foundation. The donor wanted his daughter's birthday as a memorable one. He invited the guests at ITC Grand and asked the invitees not to gift anything to his daughter but instead give Cash gifts in the donation box of the organisation. The donor collected Rs. 1,56,503/- and all this was given to Child Help Foundation. The Cash gift was given to the Child Help Foundation towards the Campaign of "Beti Bachao and Beti Padhao". This cash gift was given to two girl children who were poor and unable to pay their fees. Child Help Foundation presented the cheque to the Headmaster of Christ King Middle school, Tambaram in Chennai where these two girls studied.

Dadasaheb's Phalke Grandson's Visit at our Child Care Institution

We at Child Help Foundation are in constant coordination with Child Care Institutions across India for education support. This programme is particularly with the mission of encouraging girl children to learn – "Beti Bachao and Beti Padao." In the month of February, we had guests of Child Help Foundation wherein we coordinated to meet the girl children at Desire Society. This institution has 28 girls suffering from HIV. The guest, DadaSaheb Phalke's Grandson, visited the Desire Society. He interacted with the girls and motivated them. There were activities like dancing, singing and games. The solo dance and group dance was also performed in front of the guest. The girls enjoyed it and it brought meaning to the lives of these girl children.





International Women’s Day 2019(8thMarch)

The theme for International Women’s Day (8th March) this year is, “**Think Equal, Build Smart, Innovate for Change**”, puts innovation by women and girls. This inspires women to think big and it has sowed seeds at the heart of each woman to achieve gender equality. Child Help Foundation celebrated Women’s day by giving the women staff a token of appreciation for their contribution towards serving the poor children with the talent they possess



Prevention of Sexual Harassment training

Prevention of Sexual Harassment Training was conducted for the staff at Child Help Foundation. There were discussions on the existent issues of women and crimes committed against them. It was shared that even children were sexually abused in schools.

Highlights of the training: Created awareness on sexual harassment and how it is a legal offence, promoting a safe working environment by encouraging women to speak up if they find any unacceptable behaviour, ensuring that every women staff in CHF understands the law and implications of sexual harassment, role of the employer, employees and about the committee. Making the workplace safe and secure for our women was the major objective behind the promotion of this training.



Zero Hunger (SDG2)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation aims to eliminate Hunger from India by 2030 which is in accordance with Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In 2019-20 CHF was able to provide food and nutrition to children across India.





ACHIEVING NUTRITION AND ZERO HUNGER

Seek to end Hunger and all forms of Malnutrition: (SDG2)

SDG2 aims to achieve Zero Hunger by 2030. One of the key programmes/initiatives of Child Help Foundation (CHF) is also to eliminate hunger from the society which is in accordance with SDG2 goals as defined by the UN. Malnutrition and extreme hunger constitute the barrier to reaching this goal. During climatic catastrophes, pandemics there are shortages of food and the population faces the threat of food security. Child Help Foundation is enabling access to Healthy and Nutritious Food.

Child Help Foundation ensures no child dies of starvation and fights malnutrition in the most affected areas especially tribal areas. India is the second-largest country in terms of child population with 1.21 billion children. An estimated 26 million children are born every year; it comprises 13.1% of the child population aged 0 – 6 years in our country. Nutritional Element is the basic essential of physical and mental development. According to WHO, **43% of children are underweight**. It is very high compared to other countries like Pakistan, China, Brazil and Africa. Although malnutrition among the children reduced significantly, still the number of malnourished children is very high in the country.

Malnutrition is rampant in the Developing Countries. The reasons behind the increase in this issue are the grave declination in economic growth and less agricultural productivity under this lockdown. Over 90 million are malnourished in developing countries, Zero Hunger is Goal No.2 under the United Nations Development Programme. India is on the journey of making a home **for 0% Stunted Children, 100% access to adequate food to children all year round**. Child Help Foundation is on a journey in aiding the provision of food in marginalized societies. The ratio of agricultural land to the farmers and even productivity has been a major issue in food production.

Jharkhand Feeding Programme: Child Help Foundation partnered with Helping Hands Group, Chaibasa to feed underprivileged people. The resources to feed were provided by Child Help Foundation. Children were provided with the best quality food, clothes and educational materials. The money resource was collected through Social Media Platform, a total of 713 children were served through this programme. The poor and old aged people were also served during this period.





Humanitarian Relief (SDG11, 13 & 17)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation has been at the forefront in providing aid to children and people affected by natural calamities. In 2019-20, CHF provided aid to children and families hit by cyclones, floods and even with the novel corona virus.





HUMANITARIAN RELIEF

Building Resilient Communities: (SDG11, 13 & 17)

Child Help Foundation (CHF) strongly supports Humanitarian Relief Initiatives and reaches out to affected people in calamity emergency situations. Various parts of the country were affected by nature's fury in the form of floods and storms. Child Help Foundation staff and volunteers fanned out across different states in India where humanitarian help and support was needed the most.

North East: Assam was badly affected by the floods as many of its villages was totally cut off from the mainland which resulted in loss of lives, properties and standing crops. People were stranded without food, drinking water and day to day essentials. Almost 80% of Assam's villages were helpless in the face of the deluge and wholeheartedly welcomed relief interventions by Child Help Foundation. Child Help Foundation along with its partner Xondhon Foundation (is an NGO which shares insights of technology & innovation for the advancement of the people) fanned out to reach the last flood-affected villages through roads, ferries and on foot. We were rewarded with smiles and words of gratitude from 451 families whom we could help out in their need of the hour.

Western Region: Many states of Western India faced the fury of nature similar to the one experienced the previous year. Various villages, districts and towns were badly flooded and for the affected it was a daily struggle for survival. Child Help Foundation reached out to the flood affected people. There were many other humanitarian agencies working on the ground that helped the flood victims with the aid received from the State and Central Government bodies. In these hours of natural calamities, it is the collective determination of purpose that steers us towards our goal of reaching out to the maximum by harnessing our collaborative spirits. Child Help Foundation in partnership with Xondhan Foundation rolled out its relief operations in four badly affected regions in the state of Maharashtra. In Sangli and Kolhapur we reached out to 16175 people, covered 6995 families and touched the lives of 2670 children. The relief package consisting of rice, lentils, wheat flour, toiletries and hygiene Kits, were distributed to 2445 families while 1070 children were given biscuits packet in relief operation at Kakhe and Degwadi village of Kolhapur. We partnered with Xondon foundation again and the team identified 800 families and 185 children in Rajapur village who were provided with food rations. These families were the most affected and needed immediate interventions; hence these beneficiaries received the relief packages from us directly in their relief camps.

We are also passionate to help the children to continue their learning and we identified three Government schools at June Paragaon in Kolhapur where we gave 95 children School Kits to motivate them to continue their education.

The Pandemic-Covid19: The March month of 2020 witnessed the arrival of the pandemic Covid-19. The government of India finally called for a nation-wide lockdown on 20th March 2020. This challenge was a novel experience for all of us and we got ready to combat the same by our efforts to help and support the warriors of Covid-19. From our headquarters in Mumbai, Child Help Foundation team reached out to BMC and Police stations. Our team conducted awareness sessions on Coronavirus (Covid 19) for the BMC workers and officials. Similarly we did the same for the Police team at various police stations across Mumbai, where we reached out to 50 police stations. The beneficiaries were distributed masks, sanitizers, kits, they were sensitised about washing hands and maintaining social distance. As a complimentary gesture, we also arranged a luncheon for the attendees of the Corona Awareness Sessions. These were interactive sessions which encouraged people to put forward their queries and air their doubts about the Corona's dos and don'ts.



Awareness on Coronavirus in Bhayandar Municipal Corporation

Child Help Foundation had taken steps to create awareness about Coronavirus to Mira Bhayander Municipal Corporation (MBMC) office members as well as to various Police Stations. Child Help Foundation Staff members were the facilitators of the programme. The MBMC Staff are responsible to maintain cleanliness and hygiene in the city, hence they are the most vulnerable section and it was imperative that Corona awareness was created amongst them to enable them to safeguard themselves from this dreaded pandemic. We reached out to 350 MBMC workers and their officials Mr. Anil Rathod (Office in charge) and Mr. Mohan Kamble (Sanitary Inspector) were also present. The awareness sessions were emphasized upon the age old saying "Prevention is better than Cure". The pandemic created panic across the country and hence these awareness sessions were the need of the hour because 'to be forewarned is to be forearmed'. In these times of Pandemic, it is very hard to create concretization of actions and thoughts in every community in the city but we were focused to touch upon some sections of the COVID warriors such as MBMC and Police staff and their officials. Their safety ensured the safety of the public at large!!

PPE Kits and Masks Distribution

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as a garment, were distributed to protect the health workers from being infected. This included things like the face protection, goggles and mask or face shield, gloves, gown or coverall, head cover and rubber boots. As this is the most important garment to prevent transmission of the disease. Child Help Foundation decided to help hospitals with the provision of PPE Kits, 500 PPE kits were distributed to some hospitals viz. Lourdes Hospital, Well-Care Hospital, Sahyadri Hospital, New HCG Bangalore Hospital, Sion Hospital and Bharath HCG Hospital along with 100 Masks.

Eastern Region: The Kolkata team was amongst the first to formulate a structured plan and work tirelessly towards benefitting the flood victims in their region. The team generated resources for flood relief from the Rotary Club of Barrackpore and Rotary Club of RCIIIT. The distribution of relief materials were collected and packed by CHF and made ready to be given to the most affected lot. There were 200 beneficiaries who were helped in being resilient by providing relief materials. The materials were also transported through rails to the flood victims. The Kolkata team worked with zeal and compassion to ensure thousand smiles for the Child Help Foundation.



Southern Region: Hubli in Northern Karnataka was affected the most by the flood. Child Help Foundation was on the ground extending its helping hand for the flood victims. We distributed the food and the essentials packets to 300 families benefitting more than 1800 individuals.





Deep Southern Region: Kerala for the second year in a row faced the fury of the floods. Heavy rains lashed the state with vengeance and Kerala was submerged in the deluge. Over 2.51 lakh people in various parts of Kerala took shelter in 1,639 relief camps created for housing the helpless victims. The data from the Kerala State Disaster Management states that as many as 1,789 houses had been damaged. The number of partially damaged houses totalled up to 14,542. The state authorities reported 80 landslides in the span of 2 days, in which many people were feared to be buried alive. Districts that were severely affected included Wayanad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, Kannur, Palakkad, Thrissur and Ernakulam district. Child Help Foundation put a structured and robust plan in place for relief interventions in these affected areas. There were volunteers collecting donations of Rs. 9100 for flood relief wherein 100 individual beneficiaries were provided with relief materials.



Meals Distribution During Covid 19

The Pandemic saw poverty stricken daily wage labourers lose out on their livelihood. They were also faced with immediate hunger problems and a bleak future, so the immediate requirement was to beat the hunger pangs of these labourers and their families. Child Help Foundation works closely to ensure Zero Hunger (United Nations Strategic Development Goal) amongst the marginalised children and their family members. Our Zero-Hunger warriors mobilised themselves on the ground across the country, especially in the areas where poverty and unemployment rates were high. Child Help Foundation tied up with Khushiyaan Foundation and Roti Ghar to distribute food packets to the most vulnerable and needy section of the society. Through our Roti Ghar initiative we were able to provide warm meals to 42,320 people. Humane action does not limit itself to providing relief to mankind alone but includes in its fold the other creatures in nature. Hence, how could we forget our cows, cats and dogs that have equal rights for our kindness and compassion. Child Help Foundation's wing Paws and Claws Official took to streets to feed these animals. The United Nations mentioned in the charter that when an international problem strikes, "to achieve international co-operation in solving international problems of an economic, social, cultural, or humanitarian character." It is the need of the hour for tapping resources and providing for food as the basic essential for their own survival.





Khushiyaan Foundation: Ever since the lockdown began in March 2020 there were a lot of people from the economically weaker sections of the society who were affected by the pandemic. Most of these people were migrant workers with little savings and with little access to food, clothing and shelter. CHF looking at the plight of these people partnered with “Khushiyaan Foundation” to set up an emergency feeding programme for the needy. Through this programme CHF is providing warm, healthy and freshly prepared meals to the underprivileged sections of the society.

Child Help Foundation in partnership with “Khushiyan Foundation” is providing healthy cooked meals especially for migrant workers and families.

The areas covered are Charkop, Borivali, Thane East and Airoli – 19 &20 Sector. The Feeding Programme is not restricted to Maharashtra but also in Odisha, Bangalore and Hyderabad.

Providing meals to the rag pickers, BPL (Below Poverty Line) Slum kids, safai walas and security guards. As a part of warm food distribution, we were able to reach 42,320 beneficiaries.





Life on Land (SDG15)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation, in the year 2019-20, started a new initiative to become the Voice Of Voiceless animals and started feeding stray animals. The feeding programme hopes to lessen the human animal conflict and provide to give nutritious food to animals.





LIFE ON LAND

To sustain and flourish life on Land: (SDG15)

Humans depend on the Earth for sustenance and livelihood. Most of the human diet has been acquired from life on land. Even though we humans rely on life on land for most of our life, only 15% of the land is protected keeping biodiversity still at risk. Nearly 7,000 species of animals and plants have been illegally traded. Wildlife trafficking not only erodes biodiversity but also creates insecurity and feeds corruption. Urgent action must be taken to reduce the loss of natural habitats and biodiversity which are part of our common heritage. The United Nations (UN) considering this loss to the habitat has come with Sustainable Development Goal 15 (SDG15) drafted in the year 2015 i.e. Life on Land

Child Help Foundation (CHF) also considers it as an important goal and has started its action towards the purpose. CHF feeds several stray dogs every day to keep them from starving. As CHF believes in improving the lives of all, the organisation's footsteps are towards achieving this goal that includes all lives.

There are a lot of strays in the Mira Bhayandar belt who often scavenge for food in dustbins or garbage. CHF is aware of the problems faced by stray animals; hence it was decided to feed the strays to keep them healthy and away from any diseases. During COVID19 lockdown, when there was less food available even to humans, mere survival had also become difficult, the plight of stray animals worsened. During the lockdown stray animals found it hard to get food as most of them depended on feeders or were at the mercy of kind people on the street who often used to buy some biscuits or feed them with Rotis. CHF team during the lockdown identified many strays that weren't able to get food and our volunteers made it a mission to feed as many strays as possible. One of the main goals of our volunteers was to ensure that no stray animal sleeps on an empty stomach.

The Region- wise Distribution of food for Strays is as follows;

Odisha Street feeds reached are 39

Street Animals were able to feed 200 stray animals.

The total strays fed during this period that met their hunger through the intervention of CHF is 2,039.





Life Below Water (SDG14)

Activities Conducted in 2019-20

Child Help Foundation is aware of the growing plastic menace in the society and in 2019-20, started beach clean up activities that aims to remove hazardous waste from the beaches and help in maintaining the marine ecosystem.



LIFE BELOW WATER

To Conserve and sustain the use of the oceans for sustainable development: (SDG14)

71% of our planet is water-covered, and the oceans hold 96.5% of all Earth's water. The world's ocean drives global systems that make the planet habitable for humankind. Over 3 billion people depend on marine and coastal diversity for their livelihoods. Humans are contaminating the planet's seashores and ocean floors and endangering the rich biodiversity of our oceans. Marine pollution is reaching alarming levels most of which is plastic dumped by humans. This in turn has caused a counterbalance in our oceans.

However, today we are seeing 30% of the world's fish stocks overexploited, reaching below the level of sustainable yields. Oceans also absorb about 30 percent of the carbon dioxide produced by humans and 26% of ocean acidification since the beginning of the industrial revolution. There is a great concern of Marine Pollution, the majority of pollution comes from land-based sources with an average of 13,000 pieces of plastic litter found in every square kilometre of ocean. The SDGs aim to sustainably manage and protect marine and coastal ecosystems from pollution as well as address the impacts of ocean acidification. In order to have a sustainable planet for the future generations Child Help Foundation along with For Future India Official took upon the onus of cleaning the beaches and ensuring safe clean beaches. These are a committed group of people who ensure that the beaches remain clean and in pristine condition. The volunteers have taken up the responsibility to save our beaches from plastic pollution. The beaches of Mumbai play an important role in the marine ecosystem and are often used by locals and tourists for sightseeing or picnic. These people often dump their leftovers on the seashores thereby dirtying the beach. The beach clean-up activity is not only making the beaches clean and beautiful but also helps in protecting the mangroves. We were able to remove 4,790 kilos of trash from the various beaches across Mumbai.
